
European Service-Learning

EUROPEAN SERVICE-LEARNING

...is not an independent pedagogical concept

...but an idea to use **S-L for Education on Europe** and to use **S-L internationally**

...and thereby applying the general S-L methodology as well as more specific pedagogical concepts such as Intercultural Service-Learning as well as International Service-Learning

GOAL AND CONTENT OF PROJECTS



REFLECTION ON EUROPEAN TOPICS

Pupils deal with the question of how they can better protect the environment in the school context and in their everyday lives AND exchange their perspectives with pupils from another country AND become climate ambassadors by collecting information and developing concepts.

Pupils study musical eras in Europe AND organize a charity event in which they play music to raise money for an orphanage in Ukraine.

Project Ideas

Pupils deal with the topic of "European elections from the age of 16" AND get other young people interested in the topic of Europe.

Pupils deal with civic participation and local politics in politics lessons AND develop a campaign in cooperation with the city's European Affairs Officer to inform EU citizens that they can vote in local elections.



"Europe in our Community"

"The EU is (too) far away for me and has nothing to do with my everyday life." You can hear this sentence every day.

With this photo-based method, pupils explore the European dimension of their immediate surroundings and their everyday lives. It helps them to reflect on how closely our everyday lives are now linked to the European Union and which European challenges are also visible and therefore tangible right on our doorstep.



"Europe in our community"

Establish a personal connection to Europe with self-made photos and explore a real need

Quality standards: reflection, real needs

Level of reflection: personal reference to Europe, social context

Focus: Introduction to the topic, project development, initialization

Duration: 45-90 minutes (depending on research time)



"Europe in our community" – Step by Step

Assign a research task that the students can accomplish by taking pictures.

The pupils take photos individually or in groups in the district.


The pupils select one to three photos and present them in a joint reflection round. For the joint reflection, we recommend printing out the photos and hanging them up for a gallery walk.

Reflect with the students in class.

The photo impulse is the starting point for asking the photographers in-depth reflection questions about the captured situation.

The pupils derive ideas for possible engagement from the reflection.







EUROPEAN ELECTIONS IN JUNE 2024


- June, 6-9, 2024
- Last election in May 2019
- 705 members of the European Parliament (MEPs) will be selected
- Age for Voting: 16 years in Austria, Malta, Belgium and Germany (both for the first time), 17 in Greece, 18 in all other EU member states




